have to have chemotherapy or radiation but was put on medication.

Unfortunately another spot was discovered on her pancreas in February of 2005. Charlene underwent more surgery to remove her spleen, gall bladder and part of her pancreas.

Charlene was very thankful for the many prayers received from her husband. family and friends and said thev really helped her Charlene cope. "I thought said. positively and was determined to beat this."

During her fight against cancer Cancer Services provided her with: equipment. bandages. connected her with a State discount prescription card, nutrition, medication and travel reimbursement. Charlene says "Cancer Services has been remarkably wonderful".
